6 Best Summer Foods for Weight Loss

1. **Chilled Soups**—like gazpacho or cucumber-dill that contain lots of chunky vegetables are a great way to start a meal.
2. **Watermelon**—half of a watermelon comes from water, it is great way to satisfy thirst and a yen for something sweet.
3. **Salads**—make for quick, healthy meals—with no recipes required. Just give the produce a quick rinse; slice, dice, toss fruits, vegetables, low-fat cheese, a handful of toasted nuts with some salad greens and a light raspberry or ginger vinaigrette
4. **Grilled Veggies**—like onions, bell peppers, zucchini, carrots, eggplant, asparagus, and garlic. They can be kept in your fridge and used to make dishes like: grilled vegetable and goat cheese salads, grilled vegetable pitas and or grilled vegetable, ricotta, and fresh herb pasta and frittatas.
5. **Low and No-Calorie Beverages**— try these refreshing drinks and treats without blowing your diet:
 - A) Root Beer or Orange Dream Float—1/2 cup vanilla frozen yogurt in 12 ounces of diet root beer or orange soda (100 calories)
 - B) Tart Lemon Pom Spritzer—12 ounces of lemon sparkling water mixed with the juice of 1 lemon and 1/4 cup pomegranate juice, served over ice (35 calories)
 - C) Large (24-oz) Ice Skim Latte from Starbucks (110 calories)
6. **Fruit-Based Desserts**—some suggestions:
 - ♥grilled banana sundaes made with low-fat ice cream,
 - ♥grilled pineapple with rum and pecans,
 - ♥grilled white peaches with blackberries and honey,
 - ♥frozen, dark, sweet cherries,
 - ♥a chocolate-covered frozen banana
 - ♥frozen grapes

The fear of rejection may be one of the most basic fears of the human experience. Dr. Joe Harding tells a heartwarming story of a man who finally decided to ask his boss for a raise in salary. It was Friday. He told his wife that morning what he was about to do. All day, the man felt nervous and apprehensive. Late in the afternoon, he summoned the courage to approach his employer. To his delight, the boss agreed to a raise.

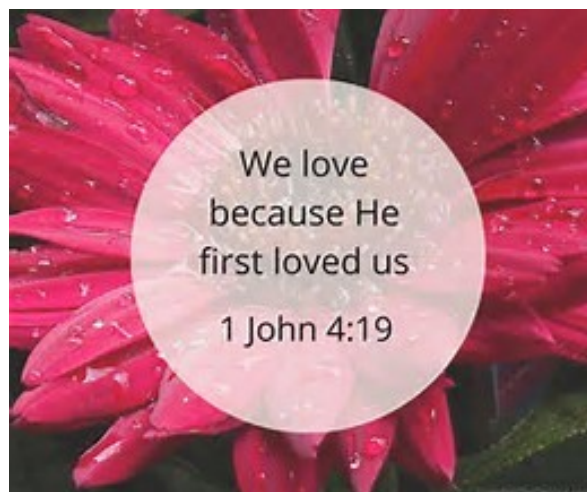
The man arrived home to a beautiful table set with their best china. Candles were lit. His wife had prepared a festive meal. Immediately, he figured that someone from the office had tipped her off! Finding his wife in the kitchen, he told her the good news. They embraced and kissed, then sat down to a wonderful meal. Next to his plate, the man found a beautiful lettered note. It read: "Congratulations, darling! I knew you'd get the raise! These things will tell you how much I love you.

While on his way to the kitchen to get dessert, he noticed that a second card had fallen from her pocket. Picking it off the floor, he read: "Don't worry about not getting the raise! You deserve it anyway! These things will tell you how much I love you."

Total acceptance! Total love. Her love for him was not contingent upon his success at work. In fact, just the opposite. If he were to fail there, if he were to be rejected by his boss, he'd be all the more accepted at home. She stood behind him no matter what; softening the blows, healing the wounds, believing in him, loving him. We can be rejected by almost anyone if we're loved by one.

That's the way families can be with each other. And I like to think that's the way God is with us, too! "We love because He first loved us."

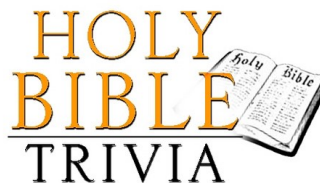

Alive unto Righteousness

*"Who His own self bare our sins in His body upon the tree, that we,
Having died unto sins, might live unto righteousness."
1 Peter 2:24*

Here in the Epistle of Peter, we have the same lessons that Paul taught us. First is the atonement of the cross: *"Who His own self bare our sins in His body upon the tree."* And then comes the fellowship of the cross: *"That we, having died unto sins, might live unto righteousness."*

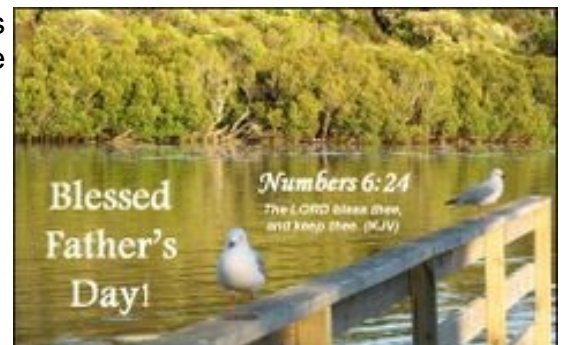
In this last expression, we have the great thought that a Christian cannot live to righteousness unless he knows that he has died to sin. We need the Holy Spirit to make our death to sin such a reality that we know we are forever free from its power and will therefore yield our *"members as instruments of righteousness unto God"* (Romans 6:13).

Dear Christian, it cost Christ much to bear the cross and then to yield Himself so that it could bear Him. It cost Him much when He cried, *"Now is my soul troubled; and what shall I say? Father, save Me from this hour: but for this cause came I unto this hour"* (John 12:27).

Let us not imagine that the fellowship of the cross—concerning which Peter wrote the words, *"That we, having died unto sins, might live unto righteousness"* - is easily understood or experienced. It means that the Holy Spirit will teach us what it is to be identified with Christ in His cross. It means that we realize by faith how we truly shared with Christ in His death, and now, as He lives in us, we abide in unceasing fellowship with Him, the Crucified One. This cost self-sacrifice; it cost earnest prayer; it cost a wholehearted surrender to God, to His will, and to the cross of Jesus; it cost abiding in Christ and having unceasing fellowship with Him.

Blessed Lord, reveal to us each day through the Holy Spirit the secret of our lives in You. Let Your Spirit reveal to us that as truly as we died in You, You now live in us the life that was crucified and now is glorified in heaven. Having died to sin, and being forever set free from its dominion, let us know that sin can no more reign over us or have dominion. (see Romans 6:14). In the power of Your redemption, let us yield ourselves to God as those who are alive from the dead, ready and prepared for all His will.

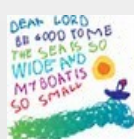

June 18, 1966	Samuel Nabrit becomes first Black to serve on Atomic Energy Commission.

June 23, 1940	Olympic athlete Wilma Rudolph is born.
June 24, 1896	Booker T. Washington becomes the first Black to receive an honorary degree from Harvard University.
June 29, 1886	Photographer James Van Der Zee is born.
June 30, 1917	Chanteuse Lena Horne is born.



Marian Wright Edelman was born in Bennettsville, South Carolina on June 6, 1939. Following her father's last words, "Don't let anything get in the way of your education," she attended Marlboro Training High School and went on to Spelman College. She traveled the world on a Merrill Scholarship and studied in the Soviet Union as a Lisle fellow. Joining the Civil Rights Movement, her activism resulted in her being arrested, which led to her studying law and enrolling at Yale Law School where she earned a Juris Doctorate in 1963. She was the first African American woman admitted to the Mississippi Bar and began practicing law with the NAACP Legal Defense

and Educational Fund's Mississippi Office. The Children's Defense Fund was founded as a voice for poor children; children of color, and children with disabilities in 1973. In 1967, she met Robert Edelman who was an Assistant to Robert Kennedy and they married in 1968. To this marriage three children were born. Mrs. Edelman has received numerous awards, such as: 1988 Albert Schweitzer Prize for Humanitarianism, 1995 Community of Christ International Peace Award, 2000 Presidential Medal of Freedom.

Children's Church May 2017

May 7, 2017

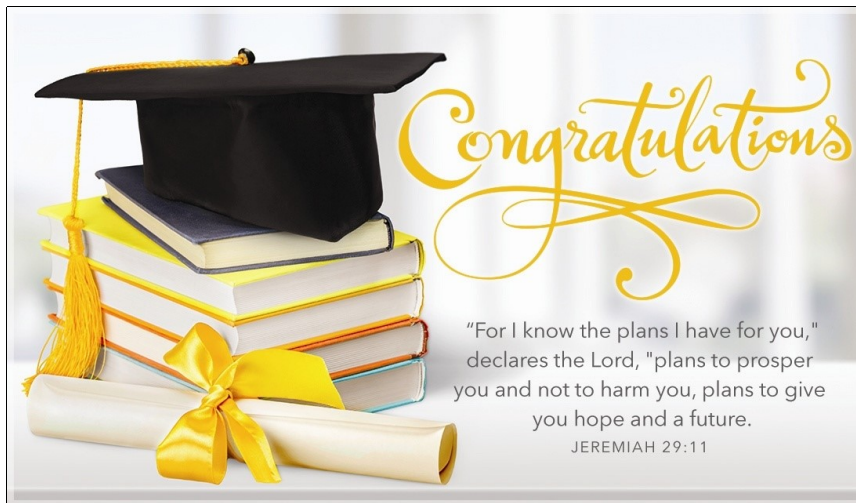
