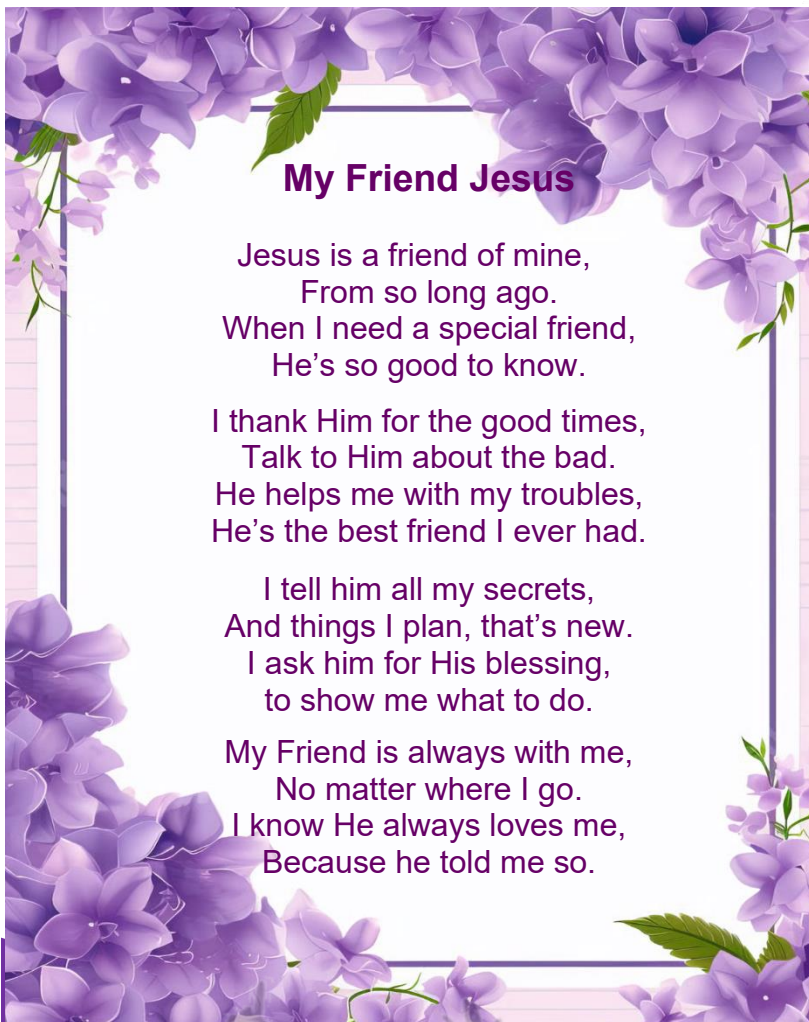

Matthew 5:14-15

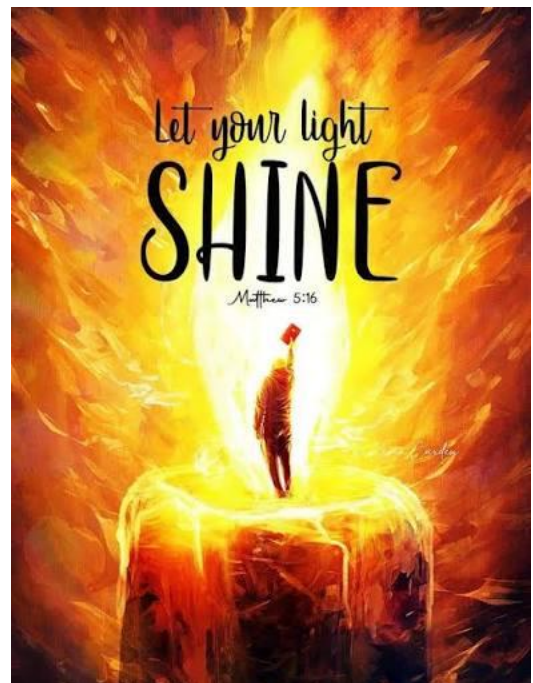

Sickle Cell Awareness Month - September

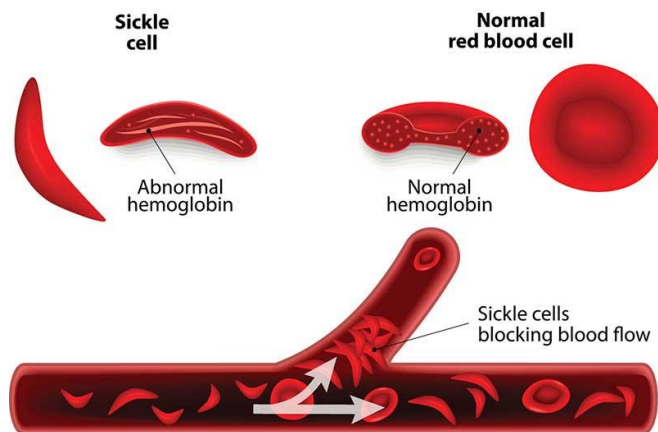
St. Petersburg's Sickle Cell Center: The Foundation for Sickle Cell Disease Research - St. Petersburg Center for Excellence held its grand opening ceremony in September 2025.

The new facility, located at 4040 49th Street North, joins fourteen (14) other foundation-led centers across the state.

Center and Local Updates

- **New Facility Operations:** The St. Petersburg Center provides specialized outpatient care, such as IV therapies and transcranial Doppler ultrasounds, alongside clinical research.
- **Transportation Access:** State funding secured by local lawmakers provides dedicated patient transport vans to help residents reach the 49th Street North clinic.
- **Community Legacy:** The clinic honors longtime local advocate Mary Murph for her decades of work with families affected by the disease in the area.
- **Mandatory Doctor Training:** A recent Florida health law mandates that DEA-registered practitioners prescribing controlled substances take continuing education on sickle cell disease and pain care, aiming to improve emergency and clinical treatment experiences for patients.
- **Services Provided:** Family Support Group, Scholarships, Educational Presentations, Genetic Counseling, Christmas Activities / Gifts, Referral Services, Wishing Fund, Emergency Family Assistance and Recreational Enrichment.

The center is dedicated to Mary Murph, the founder and president of the St. Petersburg Chapter of the Sickle Cell Disease Association of America. She became an advocate for sickle cell disease research over fifty (50) years ago after her two daughters were diagnosed with the condition. One of them passed away from the disease.



According to the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute, sickle cell disease is an illness that impacts hemoglobin, or the “major protein that carries oxygen in red blood cells.”

This causes red blood cells to be inadequately shaped and can result in blocked blood flow, implications include severe pain, stroke, lung issues, infections, and kidney disease.

September is Sickle Cell Awareness Month. The Sickle Cell Disease Association of America – St. Petersburg Chapter will host a Sickle Cell fundraiser dinner and music extravaganza on Saturday, September 26, 2026, at the University of South Florida ballroom.

Founded in Harlem, New York in 1921, Black Swan Records was the first widely distributed, African American-owned and operated record label in the United States. Harry Pace established the label alongside songwriter W.C. Handy, which was in honor of Elizabeth Taylor Greenfield, a famous 19th-century African American opera singer known as "The Black Swan." This label's mission was to give African American artists creative and economic control of their talent. Some of their performers were Ethel Waters, Fletcher Henderson and Trixie Smith. The Value of Things.....

A billionaire died at age 56 from pancreatic cancer. His last words give us pause for thought:

"In the end, money is just a part of life I'd grown accustomed to. But now, lying in bed with this illness and looking back, I realize that all the fame and wealth I accumulated means nothing in the face of death."

Take care of yourself. Treat others with respect.

The older we get, the more we realize that a \$30 watch and a \$300 watch tell the same time. A \$30 wallet and a \$300 wallet hold the same amount of money.

Whether we drive a \$150,000 car or a \$30,000 car, the road is the same and we arrive at the same place. Whether we live in a 300-square-meter house or a 3,000-square-meter house, we are equally alone.

MEMBER HIGHLIGHTS

September is National Sickle Cell Month



When we think of Sickle Cell, immediately we think of Mrs. Mary Murph, a woman of great faith in God with a charitable heart. She has given her service to those who are less fortunate in health, and Sickle Cell wellness. Her journey with Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) started over 55 years ago with an aggressive campaign to connect with people globally, despite having limited resources. Her efforts included setting up the initial SCD office in her home while assisting her own family members with the same illness. Patients have reached out to her at 2:00 am to complain of racism and implicit biases exhibited toward them by medical personnel in the ER and the local hospitals. This was due to a lack of health equity, and knowledge on SCD. Forging ahead with strength and courage, she began to present Sickle Cell public awareness on radio, TV, newspaper articles, and letters to U.S. Presidents, Congressmen. She has walked the halls in the State, and National Capital lobbying for Sickle Cell Disease.

Ms. Murph is very grateful for the office at the Evara Health Center at 1311 22nd St. So. She has an impressive Board of Directors who helps in advancing equity health care for SCD Clients. Over the years, Ms. Murph has celebrated many accomplishments, honors, and awards on the local, and National levels. To name a few, she was featured on National Heart, Blood, and Lung Institute's (NHBLI), "Today's Faces and stories of strength and perseverance of people fighting Sickle Cell Disease." She recently received the Sickle Cell Disease Association of America National Empowerment Award in Chicago, Illinois for going above and beyond in championing the needs of the Sickle Cell community. Ms. Murph is most honored to have one of Dr. Bronte's 15 Foundations for SCD Research dedicated in her name, a lasting tribute to her voice, her vision, and her fight for a brighter future for Sickle Cell Disease.

Mrs Murph feels fortunate to have extraordinary members on the Board, such as Ms. Lula Love, Dr. Carol Sims and Dr. Donna Pringle.
